4. All fish being brought to weigh in must be consumed/used by the angler following weigh in—EXCEPT for ALL BARRAMUNDI as the Senior and Junior Barramundi Category is Catch and Release only (see guidelines for photographic recording).
5. All photographic entries for the Catch and Release Barramundi category—SENIOR AND JUNIOR are to be provided to the judges/organisers no later than 4pm on Sunday 3rd April, 2016.
6. Where possible photographic entries for the Catch and Release Barramundi category—SENIOR & JUNIOR are to be emailed to gulfbarrarestocking@gmail.com anytime during the events official hours of 6am Saturday 2nd April to 4pm on Sunday 3rd April—where this is not possible then the photographs must be presented for determination and identification between 2.30pm and 4pm SUNDAY 3rd April ONLY at the Karumba Lodge Hotel
7. Lucky nomination prizes—only those people who have nominated in the event and can provide their receipt number will be eligible to claim nomination prizes—**Senior Nomination Prizes—must be in attendance.**
8. The presentation of Category winners and Nomination Prize winners will commence at the Karumba Lodge Hotel from 6.30pm through to approx. 8.30pm on Sunday 3rd April, 2016.
9. A separate nomination form is to be used for each individual—Senior and/or Junior.

2. Complete all sections of the nomination form, sign and lodge with the correct entry fee at the KARUMBA LODGE HOTEL—this is the only location for nominations to be lodged and accepted.
3. Nominations close at 11am on Saturday 2nd April, 2016—no late lodgment will be accepted.
4. Please note the nomination fee is CASH ONLY as we have no credit card facilities and will not accept cheques.
5. Anyone wanting to weigh in—must have already completed the nomination form, lodged and been issued their ID/Registration card—NOTE: fish caught prior to lodging your nomination form will not be accepted for consideration in the event.
6. No refunds will be provided.

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Department of Agriculture, Fisheries & Forestry Rules Apply

- Each individual is responsible for complying with official bag limits & size restrictions of species in the area. The information provided in these Rules and Guidelines is considered accurate and correct at time of printing (25/2/2016)
- Participants are to be aware undersize and unwanted fish are to be returned to the water as soon as possible with the aim being to minimize harming or injuring fish and marine life.
- Organisers wish to emphasise the importance of observing and carrying out the safe and humane handling of all fish caught. This **INCLUDES *catfish, sharks and other so called 'undesirable' species.*** **NOTE: Only those fish to be consumed by the angler are to be brought in for weigh in.**
- In addition it is important to use all care and responsibility towards the natural environment—no littering or polluting of Karumba and environs—both the marine and land environment—will be tolerated.

Event Information

- Nominations: Adult \$15/Junior \$8 (6 -15 yrs incl) and Junior \$3 (0-5yrs incl)
- Juniors 5yrs and younger may nominate and will be eligible to enter fish for the Junior Mystery Weight Category and will be eligible for Junior Early Bird and Nomination prizes.
- Nomination form must be fully completed, signed and lodged with payment of fee to be eligible for participation—at the time of lodging the nomination form an event ID will be issued which must be presented for each and every fish weighed in and to claim any nomination prizes.

BOUNDARIES - Karumba and Environs

DURATION

- The Karumba Community Anglers Classic commences on Saturday 2nd April at 6am and closes on Sunday 3rd April at 4pm.
- The only official weigh in point will be the Karumba Town Boat Ramp area.
- Weigh in times will be strictly adhered to. Fish to only be weighed in by person who caught the fish and providing the appropriate ID Card. Results of the event will be published in the Gulf Chronicle and displayed on www.karumba.qld.au website within 2 weeks of the events completion.
- Only fish of legal size and type (as set down by DAFF—details in this guide), **and to be consumed by the angler** following weigh in are to be brought back to the weigh in points.

CATCH & RELEASE BARRAMUNDI—JUNIOR & SENIOR

- **No BARRAMUNDI** are to be brought in for weigh in—Catch and Release only.
- **YOUR EVENT ID CARD MUST** be photographed with this and the measuring mat and the fish being fully and clearly visible. Any photos not considered to meet the criteria will not be accepted.
- All photographic entries for the Catch and Release Barramundi category—SENIOR AND JUNIOR are to be provided to the judges/organisers no later than 4pm on Sunday 3rd April, 2016.
- Where possible photographic entries for the Catch and Release Barramundi category—SENIOR & JUNIOR are to be emailed to gulfbarrarestocking@gmail.com **anytime during the events official hours of 6am Saturday 2nd April to 4pm on Sunday 3rd April**—where this is not possible then the photographs must be presented for determination and identification **ONLY between 2.30pm and 4pm Sunday 3rd April at the Karumba Lodge Hotel**

ADDITIONAL

- All fish must be weighed in whole, fresh & undamaged
- **NO cutting of fish permitted, fish can be bled by gill cut only, NO throat cuts**
- **NO gaffs permitted, brain spike is the only method permitted to kill fish**
- Any indication or evidence of fraud will result in instant disqualification—with entry fee forfeited. Queensland Police and DAFF officers will be advised

APPARATUS

- Fish to be taken by the use of hand-lines or rod/reel with bait or lure only
- NO GAFF's to be used at any time
- Landing nets are permitted to assist in landing the fish

JUDGING

- Judges decision is FINAL and no correspondence or discussion will be entered into

HAZARDS

Boat and land based participants and spectators are advised the Karumba area is home to saltwater crocodiles, a variety of sharks and in the warmer months marine stingers. Special care should be taken at all times in relation to the shipping channel and waterways which carry numerous commercial and recreational vessels. It is important to make yourself aware of the tides and area maps with many areas of sand exposed and inaccessible during low tides. Be aware of shifting sand bars.

BARRAMUNDI—CATCH & RELEASE

Junior & Senior

This event's main aim is to promote and enhance the substantial use of, and increased emphasis on:- good fish handling techniques and fishing methods to protect the future of recreational and commercial fishing in the area. This event further aims at increasing the numbers of barramundi that are released to participate in future breeding, and to strive towards these fish being released in good condition with a very good chance of survival as recommended by the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries & Forestry. **This is particularly important given the timing around their breeding season and previous 3 poor Gulf region wet seasons impacting across the Gulf marine environment and landscapes.**

Appropriate fishing practices will help us achieve these objectives, including:

- Promotion of the use of soft knotless landing nets to minimize physical damage to the landed fish.
- Use of wet hands or wet cloth when handling fish.
- Fisherpersons not placing their fingers inside the gill (which can cause damage).
- Ensuring you hold fish horizontally when measuring or taking photographs—ensuring not to compress the under belly area affecting likelihood of survival upon re-entry into the water.

The Catch & Release component of the Karumba Community Anglers Classic 2016 is an honesty system. It is really in 'your' hands

Please take the time and help to maintain the survival of Barramundi Rules

- This is a catch and release competition only. All Barramundi must be released alive.
- **No gaffs, nets or other devices other than the use of hand-lines or rod/reel with bait or lure only** to be used to capture fish.
- Photographic evidence is required for each and every Barramundi you wish to enter into the category.
- The photograph must be clear and include the entire fish, measuring mat or sticker from 0 to the length of the fish showing clearly the incremental measurements, and the event ID CARD—if any one or more of these elements is not clear or included the photograph will not be accepted as an entry.
- NOTE: Should the taking of a photograph in any way impact on the safety, health and successful release of the fish then officials require the immediate release of the fish without a photograph—in the best interests of likely survival and the focus on a sustainable fishing future.

Wherever possible photographic entries for the Catch and Release Barramundi category—SENIOR & JUNIOR are to be emailed to gulfbarrarestocking@gmail.com anytime during the events official hours of 6am Saturday 2nd April to 4pm on Sunday 3rd April—where this is not possible then the photographs must be presented for determination and identification ONLY between 2.30pm and 4pm at the Karumba Lodge Hotel.

- Protests of any nature must be brought to the attention of the Tournament Committee or Marshals on the day of the incident.
- **Purposely targeting under or oversize barramundi is illegal and will not be tolerated or accepted.**
- All decisions made by the event judges and officials concerning rules, prizes and trophies are final and no correspondence or discussion will be entered into.
